Below are bulleted items for your convenience:

- College Board is providing free remote learning resources.
- Traditional face-to-face exam administration will not take place. Students will take a 45 minute online free-response exam at home.
- For each AP subject, there will be 2 different testing dates. Some students may want to take the exam sooner rather than later, while the content is still fresh. Other students may want more time to practice. Your child can discuss these options with their AP teacher.
- The full exam schedule, specific free-response question types that will be on each AP Exam, and additional testing details will be available by April 3. College Board will unlock relevant free-response questions in AP Classroom for digital use so students can access all practice questions of the type that will appear on the exam.
- Any student already registered for an exam can choose to cancel at no charge.
- Students will be able to take these streamlined exams on any device they have access tocomputer, tablet or smartphone. Taking a photo of handwritten work will also be an option.

- The exam will only include topics and skills most AP teachers and students have already covered in class by early March.
